General Technology Associate in Applied Science

The Associate in Applied Science General Technology degree program offers students the opportunity to design a program of study to meet their individual needs.

This degree requires advance coordination between the student and a program's department head to determine a specific plan of study according to the degree outline presented below. The major courses (primary and secondary technical specialties), the general education courses, and the additional credit hours must total a minimum of 60 credit hours. Any changes in the program of study will require an updated agreement approved by the department head of the primary technical specialty.

Major Courses Required

33.0

The required core consists of a primary and a secondary technical specialty.

- Primary Technical Specialty - minimum of 21 credit hours in a single content area from an approved degree, diploma, or technical education certificate program offered at the college.
- Secondary Technical Specialty - minimum of 12 credit hours in one of two options:
 - ☐ 12 credit hours from an approved degree, diploma, or technical education certificate program offered at the college, or
 - ☐ 12 credit hours from a mix of credits awarded for coursework from any program, military training, experiential learning, and/or testing.

General Education Courses Required

15.0

For the General Technology degree completion, the general education component must include at least one course from each of the following areas:

- Mathematics/Natural Sciences
- Social/Behavioral Science
- Humanities/Fine Arts
- Oral Communications
- Written Communications

Additional Hours Required

12.0 - 36.0

- The student will work with a program advisor to choose electives that meet industry and student needs. The student may use credits in this section to develop a third technical specialty or to enhance the primary and secondary technical specialties. Courses in this section may include credits awarded for military training, experiential learning, and testing.
